At the ICS Board meeting on 29th June 22, in response to a question from the public about transport to the health and wellbeing hub, the ICS stated that ' The programme is working with the Council to ensure that there is a specific bus route that stops next to the new Hub. There are also Section 106 monies from the wider SUE South development to support a new bus route. The modelled cost savings will be developed as part of the business case'. In response to a councillor question put to them on 7th September 22, Shropshire Council Cabinet confirmed that they will not be funding public transport routes to the hub. Please could you clarify: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. If the proposals go ahead will the ICS fund bus routes to the hub if there is no adequate public transport for the patients of existing surgeries, as is the case for the preferred site on Oteley Road? b. If the ICS will not fund public transport to the hub, and none is available at their preferred site, will they proceed with their plans? 2. I understand that NHSE are considering funding the proposed Health and Wellbeing hub (a Cavel Centre) in Shrewsbury. Whilst the funding amount is not being made public at present, if the hub goes ahead and the building goes over budget who will be responsible for the overspend? 	<p>With the support of the Council, the Project Team is currently rerunning the site options appraisal to determine the most suitable alternative sites for the hub.</p> <p>A travel impact assessment will be undertaken on any shortlisted site options once they are identified. This will allow the Programme Team to understand the travel requirements</p> <p>At this point it is not possible to commit to funding services. The programme will seek to develop a specific transport approach for the chosen site once we are at that point</p> <p>The Full Business Case will only be submitted to NHSEI if it is affordable within the funding available</p>
